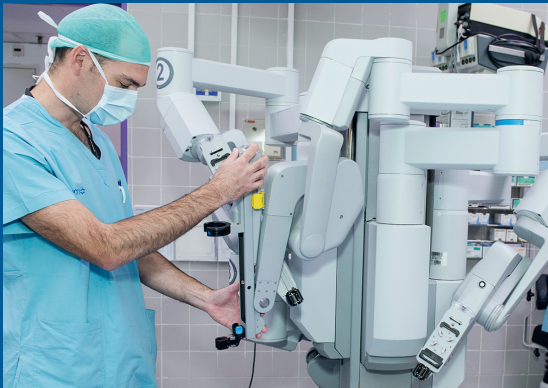

BRCA GENE SCREENING RABIN'S EARLY MANAGEMENT CLINIC

Israel's Rabin Medical Center has established the only special clinic in Israel to perform genetic screening to treat and prevent cancer. The **BRCA Multidisciplinary Clinic** was created to serve patients with a high risk of cancer at Rabin Medical Center's Davidoff Cancer Center. Since its commencement in 2011, the clinic has served thousands of women. Women who carry the BRCA gene mutation have up to an 80% chance of developing breast and/or ovarian cancer. More than 200 mutations have been identified, three of which are typical to Ashkenazi Jews. There is a 2.5% risk of carrying this mutation. One out of every forty Jewish Ashkenazi women is a carrier and has a high probability of developing ovarian and/or breast cancer. At the Rabin Medical Center BRCA Clinic, patients receive counseling, screening and follow-up care. With breast cancer at such a high rate in Israel, affecting about 31% of women suffering from malignant diseases, the **BRCA Multidisciplinary Clinic** is essential to saving lives.

The **BRCA Multidisciplinary Clinic** also treats men with prostate cancer. Research data indicates that men carry mutations in the BRCA 1 and 2 genes, similar to the syndrome for breast and ovarian cancer in women. Three thousand new cases of prostate cancer are diagnosed in Israel annually, with four hundred fatalities.

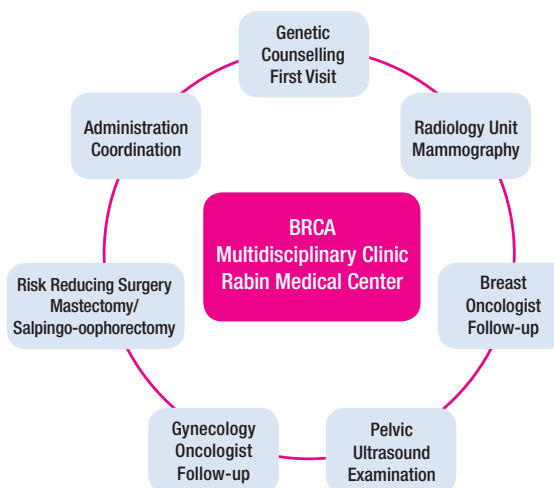
BREAST AND OVARIAN CANCER FACTS

FACT: 1 in 7 women in Israel will be diagnosed with breast cancer, and one third of these women will not survive.

FACT: In 10% of all breast cancer cases, a BRCA mutation is present and 80% of these carriers have a chance of developing breast and/or ovarian cancer.

FACT: 10% of Israeli women with breast cancer receive treatment at the Davidoff Cancer Center, which partners with Memorial-Sloan Kettering Cancer Center and Dana Farber Cancer Institute.

FACT: 2% of the Israeli population carries the BRCA gene.



RABIN'S DAVIDOFF CANCER CENTER is the leading oncology center in Israel and the Middle East, treating 50,000 annually. The Davidoff Cancer Center includes six units and clinics as well as seven departments. A major expansion will add six new floors to accommodate more patients by 2017.

REMEMBERING MY MOTHER: BREAST AND OVARIAN CANCER AWARENESS

When my father, Rabbi Walter H. Plaut, died of colon cancer in 1964, my mother, Hadassah Yanich Plaut, uprooted our family from Great Neck to Jerusalem to start a new life. In 1972, my mother was diagnosed with breast cancer. She was fifty-one. I was fifteen. My mother had a radical mastectomy. The removal of lymph nodes left my mother, a pianist, with a lymphodermic arm. Radiation treatments burnt her lungs, causing a life-long bronchial cough. Years later while on a visit to America, breast cancer reappeared and my mother had a second mastectomy.

My mother's illness never defined her; it simply became part of her life experience. She was public about her illness, even though women of her generation chose to be silent. Her illness occurred before the creation of support groups, reconstructive surgery, and partial lumpectomies. Breast cancer caused my mother to feel isolated, but she did not let cancer beat her down.




After my mother's passing in 2003, her illness and my professional life merged. I responded to a new calling: charitable work at American Friends of Rabin Medical Center (AFRMC). I realized that charity work on behalf of Israel could unite Jews in America. AFRMC has created annual events to rally support for Israel's Rabin Medical Center. In April 2011, around the time of my mother's birthday, I created the **NYC 5K Schlep: Run/Walk for Breast and Ovarian Cancer** awareness to honor my mother and realize her dream for excellent Israeli healthcare. Each year, we schlep to raise funds and awareness for cancer patients and Rabin's **BRCA Gene Multidisciplinary Clinic.**

60 MEDICAL EXCHANGE FELLOWS IN 5 YEARS

The Rabin Medical Exchange Fellows program selects top doctors, researchers and medical practitioners from hospitals and research centers in the United States and Israel to conduct research and share expertise in each other's institutions. A fellow can be sponsored and named for \$5,000-\$10,000 for two to four weeks and \$35,000 for a one to two year fellowship. During his/her observership in the USA, the Rabin Fellows engage in educational projects to benefit healthcare, treatment and research at Israel's premier medical center.



Since its launch in 2011, AFRMC has funded over 60 Rabin Fellows for medical specialization, including oncology, cardiology, orthopedics, diabetes, internal medicine, and robotic surgery at American hospitals. Such hospitals include: Boston Eye Group, Weill Cornell Medical Center, USC Keck School of Medicine, NYU Langone Medical Center, NY Mt. Sinai School of Medicine, Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center, Duke University Medical School, Columbia University Medical Center, National Institute of Health, UC San Diego Medical Center, Stanford University Medical Center and Desert Orthopaedic Center in Las Vegas.

RABIN MEDICAL CENTER: A GLOBAL LEADER IN CARDIOLOGY



The Cardiology Department at Rabin Medical Center is the largest clinical and academic cardiology program in Israel and is recognized worldwide as a leading institution. Associated with the largest healthcare organization in Israel, Clalit Health Services, the Department of Cardiology at the Rabin Medical Center is the largest referral center for the densely populated central region of Israel, offering consultations to patients nationwide.

The leading services of the Rabin Cardiology Department are the intensive cardiac care unit (ICCU), the noninvasive imaging institutes (e.g. echocardiography, nuclear cardiology, cardiac CT and cardiac MRI), the interventional cardiology institute, the heart failure institute and the electrophysiology and pacemaker units.

Rabin Medical Center's ICCU is a state-of-the-art medical facility aimed at treating the most complex and severe cardiac patients. Improved catheter-based techniques for diagnosis and proper management of heart disorders will yield a major beneficial impact upon the health of the treated patients. The Interventional Cardiology Institute of Rabin Medical Center is the largest in the country, treating annually some 10% of the Israeli cardiac population that are in need for catheter-based interventions.

CARDIOLOGY FACTS

FACT: Rabin treats about 10% of the total number of cardiac patients in Israel.

FACT: 4,000 patients are hospitalized per year in the ICCU and cardiac ward.

FACT: 35,000 patients visit the outpatient cardiology clinics annually.

FACT: 5,000 cardiac catheterization procedures are performed per year (coronary, valves, electrophysiology, pacemakers, adult congenital heart disease, heart biopsies).

FACT: The Department of Cardiothoracic Surgery, the most advanced facility in Israel performed 1,252 surgeries using the most sophisticated technology.

FACT: Rabin offers 24/7 coverage for cardiac emergencies and is a national referral center for all of Israel.

Ran Kornowski, MD, FACC, FESC, is Director of the Cardiology Department and the Institute of Interventional Cardiology at Rabin Medical Center. He is a full Professor of Cardiovascular Medicine at the Sackler Faculty of Medicine at Tel Aviv University. He served as the Chairman of the National Working Group on Interventional Cardiology on behalf of the Israel Heart Society and is the current President of the Israel Heart Society. A world-renowned cardiologist and scholar, Prof. Kornowski established a cardiovascular research institute within the Cardiology Department conducting multiple clinical trials and translational research designed towards the best patient diagnosis and care. This research involves novel therapeutic techniques, cardiac imaging modalities and innovative therapeutic strategies.

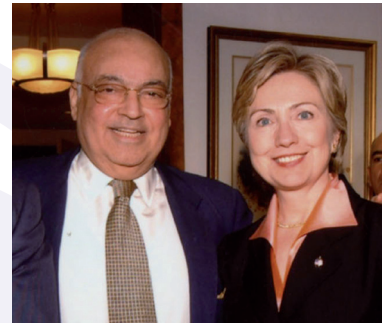
